<u>Vacancy for the post of Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officer</u> <u>Police Department</u>

Applications are invited from qualified candidates who wish to be considered for appointment as Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officer in the Police Department.

II. AGE LIMIT

Candidates, unless already in the Service, should not have reached their <u>50th</u> birthday by the closing date for the submission of applications.

III. QUALIFICATIONS

By selection from among candidates who -

- (i) are registered as general practitioner and as specialist in Forensic Medicine in accordance with legislation in force in Mauritius;
- (ii) reckon at least two years' experience as general practitioner in any recognised health institution; and
- (iii) are computer literate.

Note

- 1. Candidates should produce written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed.
- 2. Candidates should submit a copy of their Certificate of Registration as general practitioner and as specialist in Forensic Medicine in Mauritius together with their Application Form.
- 3. The onus for the submission of written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed and equivalence of qualification (if applicable) from the relevant authorities (Higher Education Commission or Mauritius Qualifications Authority) rests on the candidates. Applications will not be considered in case of non-submission of written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed and Equivalence Certificate, as appropriate, by the closing date.
- 4. Candidates may be required to take part in a written examination.
- 5. The Commission reserves the right not to make any appointment following this advertisement.

IV. DUTIES AND SALARY

- 1. To be responsible to the Commissioner of Police through the Chief Police Medical Officer for
 - (i) giving medical care to all members of the Police Force and their families;
 - (ii) providing medical assistance in rescue operations and accompanying the Special Mobile Force, National Coast Guard, Special Supporting Unit and Helicopter Unit on selected missions, on board ships at sea and the Outer Islands;
 - (iii) undertaking medical/medico-legal examinations (both clinical and pathological) and giving evidence in Courts of Law;
 - (iv) attending to medical/medico-legal examinations in Rodrigues and Outer Islands; and
 - (v) delivering lectures to members of the Police Force on subjects of medical interests such as forensic medicine.
- 2. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
- 3. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officer in the roles ascribed to him.

Note:

Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officers will be required to be on call to cater for medical/medico-legal examinations after normal working hours including Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.

The permanent and pensionable post carries salary in scale of Rs 64,400 x $1,800 - 69,800 \times 2,000 - 75,800 \times 2,150 - 82,250 \times 3,000 - 88,250 \times 3,125 - 103,875$ a month.

V. FRINGE BENEFITS

Police Medical Officer/Senior Police Medical Officers are entitled to the following benefits:

- (a) 100% duty exemption for the purchase of a car with engine capacity of up to 1601 c.c. once every five years;
- (b) loan facilities for the first purchase of a car equivalent to 21 months' salary with interest rate at 3% per annum, refundable in 84 monthly instalments:

- (c) a monthly travelling allowance of Rs 13,200 both for attending duty and for official travelling;
- (d) passage benefits at the rate of 5% of annual salary drawn;
- (e) an allowance of Rs 13,500 annually for the purchase of Medical books, e-materials, journals and other publications until such time that a smartphone of equivalent value to the allowance is provided;
- (f) refund of the full amount of annual subscription fee payable to the Medical Council of Mauritius;
- (g) an allowance of Rs 12,130 annually, cumulative over a period of three years, to meet the expenses towards the Continuing Professional Development; and
- (h) rent free telephone and free calls.
