Applications are invited from qualified officers of the Mauritius Prison Service who wish to be considered for appointment as Prisons Welfare Officer in the Mauritius Prison Service.

# II. QUALIFICATIONS

By selection from among officers of the Mauritius Prison Service who are members of the Disciplined Force who:-

- (i) reckon at least five years' service in a substantive capacity in the Mauritius Prison Service;
- (ii) possess a Cambridge School Certificate including passes in French and Mathematics or Principles of Accounts obtained on one certificate or passes in English Language, French and Mathematics or Principles of Accounts obtained on one certificate at the General Certificate of Education "Ordinary Level" or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Disciplined Forces Service Commission; and
- (iii) have proven experience in social and welfare work.

## III. DUTIES AND SALARY

- 1. To assist the Officer-in-Charge of the institution in the training and welfare of detainees.
- 2. To maintain contact between the detainees and their families.
- 3. To establish and maintain links with prospective employers and the Probation Service.
- 4. To prepare detainees for discharge.
- 5. To assist in updating the system for the overall rehabilitation of detainees.
- 6. To deal with the legal, social and family problems of detainees and liaise with their families.
- 7. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
- 8. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from Prisons Welfare Officers in the roles ascribed to them.

The permanent and pensionable post carries salary in the scale Rs 30,700 x  $825 - 35,650 \ge 900 - 37,450 \ge 950 - 42,200 \ge 1,300 - 46,100 \ge 1,575 - 49,250 \ge 1,650 - 50,900$  a month.
