<u>Vacancies for Post of Analyst (Trade)</u> Ministry of Commerce and Consumer Protection

Applications are invited from qualified candidates who wish to be considered for appointment as Analyst (Trade) in the Ministry of Commerce and Consumer Protection.

II. AGE LIMIT

Candidates, unless already in the Service, should not have reached their <u>45</u>th birthday by the closing date for the submission of applications.

III. QUALIFICATIONS

- A. A degree in Economics or Commerce or International Trade or International Business from a recognised institution <u>or</u> an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission.
- B. Candidates should -
 - (i) possess analytical skills;
 - (ii) have a good knowledge of market survey techniques and trade promotion techniques;
 - (iii) be conversant with the functions of international institutions in world trade; and
 - (iv) be computer literate.

NOTE

- 1. Candidates should produce written evidence of knowledge claimed.
- 2. The onus for the submission of written evidence of knowledge claimed and equivalence of qualification (if applicable) from the relevant authorities (Higher Education Commission or Mauritius Qualifications Authority) rests with the candidates. Applications will not be considered in case of non-submission of written evidence of knowledge claimed and Equivalence Certificate, as appropriate, by the closing date.

- 3. Candidates may be required to take part in a written examination.
- 4. The Commission reserves the right:
 - (i) to convene **only** the best qualified candidates for interview; and
 - (ii) not to make any appointment following this advertisement.

IV. DUTIES AND SALARY

- 1. To advise the business community on trade agreements entered with various countries under different trade protocols and on international trade practices.
- 2. To process and approve trade documents.
- 3. To implement trade policies and trade practices.
- 4. To follow up development on trade policy issues at the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and other international trade institutions through publications on trade reports and advise on their implementation.
- 5. To represent the Ministry in meetings, seminars, workshops and conferences on trade matters.
- 6. To attend to trade enquiries from local and foreign training concerns.
- 7. To liaise with relevant organisations for the obtention of trade statistics and economic data for trade research and analysis.
- 8. To carry out monitoring exercise regarding trade effected under preferential regimes with specific countries.
- 9. To prepare briefs on trade relations with trading partners and preferential trade regimes.
- 10. To assist in the implementation of the provisions of the Consumer Protection (Scrap Metal) Regulations.
- 11. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
- 12. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Analyst (Trade) in the roles ascribed to him.

The permanent and pensionable post carries salary in scale Rs 27,400 x 825 – $35,650 \times 900 - 37,450 \times 950 - 42,200 \times 1,300 - 46,100 \times 1,575 - 49,250 \times 1,650 - 54,200 \times 1,700 - 62,700$ a month.
