DISCIPLINED FORCES SERVICE COMMISSION CIRCULAR NOTE NO. 7 of 2025 Enlistment as Cadet Officer (Graduates) for the Flying Branch of the Police Helicopter Squadron Mauritius Police Force

Applications are invited from qualified members of the Mauritius Police Force who wish to be considered for enlistment as Cadet Officer (Graduates) for the Flying Branch of the Police Helicopter Squadron.

II. AGE LIMIT

Candidates should be not less than **22** years of age and not more than **30** years of age by the closing date for the submission of applications.

III. QUALIFICATIONS

- **A.** By selection from among members of the Police Force who -
 - (i) possess the Cambridge Higher School Certificate <u>or</u> passes in at least two subjects obtained on one certificate at the General Certificate of Education "Advanced Level" together with a degree from a recognised institution in Mathematics or Physics or Aeronautical Engineering or Mechanical Engineering or Mechanical Engineering or Mechanics Engineering; and
 - (ii) have 6/6 eyesight in both eyes without glasses or contact lenses.

OR

Equivalent qualifications to the above acceptable to the Disciplined Forces Service Commission.

B. Candidates should also possess good communication and interpersonal skills.

NOTE 1

- 1. Qualification for Cambridge Higher School Certificate or General Certificate of Education "Advanced Level" under A above should have been obtained prior to qualification at degree level.
- 2. Candidates should produce written evidence of knowledge claimed.
- 3. The onus for the submission of equivalence of qualification (if applicable) from the relevant authorities (Higher Education Commission or Mauritius Qualifications Authority) rests with the candidates. Applications will not be considered in case of non-submission of Equivalence Certificate, by the closing date.

NOTE 2

Candidates enlisted will, within a period of three months of their date of enlistment, be required to undergo an examination so as to determine their medical fitness and aptitude for flying. In case they are found medically unfit or do not reach the required standard in the aptitude test for flying, their enlistment as Cadet Officer will be terminated forthwith.

IV. TRAINING

Selected candidates will be required to undergo training in the field which may include programmes locally or abroad for a period of at least two years, as approved and arranged by the Police Department, leading to an appropriate certificate or licence, where applicable.

On successful completion of such training and on obtention of the appropriate certificate or licence, where applicable, Cadet Officers will be eligible for appointment to the grade of Deputy Assistant Superintendent of Police or Woman Police Deputy Assistant Superintendent, as and when vacancies occur.

V. ALLOWANCE

During the period of training, the selected candidates will draw an allowance in the scale Rs $23,950 \times 525 - 26,050 \times 675 - 27,400 \times 825 - 31,525$ a month.

On successful completion of their training, Cadet Officers will be eligible for appointment to the grade of Deputy Assistant Superintendent of Police or Woman Police Deputy Assistant Superintendent in the salary scale Rs $33,175 \times 825 - 35,650 \times 900 - 37,450 \times 950 - 42,200 \times 1,300 - 46,100 \times 1,575 - 49,250 \times 1,650 - 54,200$ a month.

VI. BONDING

Selected candidates who are sent on training whether abroad or locally will be required to enter into a bond and after completion of the said training, they will immediately resume duty and remain in the service of the Mauritius Police Force for a period of four years from the date of substantive appointment as Deputy Assistant Superintendent of Police or Woman Police Deputy Assistant Superintendent.

VII. MODE OF APPLICATION

- 1. Qualified candidates should submit their application on DFSC Form 7 which may be obtained either from the Enquiry Counter of the Ministry of Public Service and Administrative Reforms, Ground Floor, Emmanuel Anquetil Building, Port Louis or from the Enquiry Counter of the Public Service Commission and Disciplined Forces Service Commission, 7, Louis Pasteur Street, Forest Side or from the Chief Commissioner's Office, Port Mathurin, Rodrigues or from the offices of the Mauritius High Commissions/Embassies overseas.
- 2. Application Forms should be submitted **in duplicate**, the original to be sent directly to the Secretary, Disciplined Forces Service Commission and the duplicate through the Commissioner of Police.
- 3. This circular together with the Application Form (DFSC Form 7) are available on the website of the Public Service Commission and Disciplined Forces Service Commission at https://psc.govmu.org
- 4. Acknowledgement of applications will be made, as far as possible, by **e-mail**. Candidates are, therefore, advised to submit their e-mail address.
- 5. Candidates are also advised to read carefully the "NOTES AND INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES" before filling in the Application Form. Care should be taken to fill in the Application Form correctly. Incomplete, inadequate or inaccurate filling of the Application Form may entail elimination of the candidate.

VIII. CLOSING DATE
