

**PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION CIRCULAR NOTE NO. 23 OF 2026**

**Vacancy for Post of Deputy Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technician  
Mauritius Meteorological Services**

Applications are invited from qualified officers of the Mauritius Meteorological Services who wish to be considered for appointment as Deputy Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technician in the Mauritius Meteorological Services.

**II. QUALIFICATIONS**

By selection from officers in the grade of Principal Meteorological Telecommunications Technician (on shift) who reckon at least two years' service in a substantive capacity in the grade and who possess –

- (i) good organising skills; and
- (ii) good interpersonal and communication skills.

**III. ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

To assist the Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technician in the supervision and organisation of work of officers in the Meteorological Telecommunications Technician Cadre.

**IV. DUTIES AND SALARY**

1. To deputise for the Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technician.
2. To assist the Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technician in –
  - (i) liaising with agencies locally and abroad for the purchase and supply of electronic, radio communication and ICT equipment in the Mauritius Meteorological Services and Departments in the Outer Islands of the Republic of Mauritius;
  - (ii) ensuring the timely budgeting, indenting and receipt of necessary equipment and spare parts as well as proper storage and ready availability of such spares;
  - (iii) liaising with officers in the Procurement and Supply Cadre for the procurement/disposal of electronic and ICT equipment and consumables at the workplace; and
  - (iv) the implementation of training programmes for subordinate staff.

3. To be responsible for the –
  - (i) proper maintenance and operation of the Radar Equipment and maintenance and repairs of the Radiosonde System;
  - (ii) proper maintenance of the ICT Systems of the Mauritius Meteorological Services, including Local Area Network and WIFI network; and
  - (iii) maintenance and repairs of all electronic equipment of the Mauritius Meteorological Services within the Republic of Mauritius.
4. To contribute in ensuring that the electronic equipment are operational at all times.
5. To supervise the work of the Principal Meteorological Telecommunications Technician and other subordinate staff and provide best practice guidance in the different sections of the Telecommunications Division.
6. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
7. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Deputy Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technician in the roles ascribed to him.

**Note**

1. Deputy Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technicians may be required to follow such theoretical, practical or on-the-job training courses, as may be approved and arranged.
2. Deputy Chief Meteorological Telecommunications Technicians will be required to work at any time of the day or night including Saturdays, Sundays, Public Holidays, during cyclonic periods, natural calamities and extreme weather events in Mauritius and the Outer Islands of the Republic of Mauritius.

The permanent and pensionable post carries salary in scale Rs 46,900 x 1,050 – 49,000 x 1,100 – 54,500 x 1,450 – 58,850 x 1,750 – 62,350 x 1,850 – 67,900 x 1,900 – 71,700 a month.

Appointment in a temporary capacity carries a flat salary of Rs 46,900.

However, for the year 2026, the discounted flat salary would be Rs 44,489.

## **V. MODE OF APPLICATION**

1. Qualified candidates should submit their application on **PSC Form 7** which may be obtained **either** from the Enquiry Counter of the Ministry of Public Service and Administrative Reforms, Ground Floor, Emmanuel Anquetil Building, Port Louis **or** from the Enquiry Counter of the Public Service Commission, 7, Louis Pasteur Street, Forest Side **or** from the Chief Commissioner's Office, Port Mathurin, Rodrigues **or** from the offices of the Mauritius High Commissions/Embassies overseas.
2. Application Forms should be submitted **in duplicate**, the original to be sent directly to the Secretary, Public Service Commission and the duplicate through the Director, Mauritius Meteorological Services.

4. Acknowledgement of applications will be made, as far as possible, by **e-mail**. Candidates are, therefore, advised to submit their e-mail address.
5. Candidates are also advised to read carefully the **“NOTES AND INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES”** before filling in the Application Form. Care should be taken to fill in the Application Form correctly. **Incomplete, inadequate or inaccurate filling of the Application Form may entail elimination of the candidate.**

## **VI. CLOSING DATE**

Application Forms should reach the Secretary, Public Service Commission, 7, Louis Pasteur Street, Forest Side, **not later than 15 00 hours (local time) on Thursday 14 May 2026**. Application Forms received after the specified closing date and time will **not** be considered.
