**Vacancy for Post of Transport Analyst/Senior Transport Analyst**  
**Transport Policy Unit**  
**Ministry of Land Transport**

Applications are invited from qualified candidates who wish to be considered for appointment as Transport Analyst/Senior Transport Analyst in the Transport Policy Unit of the Ministry of Land Transport.

**II. AGE LIMIT**

Candidates, unless already in the Service, should not have reached their **45<sup>th</sup>** birthday by the closing date for the submission of applications.

**III. QUALIFICATIONS**

- A. A degree in Economics or Mathematics or Statistics or Transport Planning or Transport Management or Logistics and Transport from a recognised institution or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Public Service Commission.
- B. Candidates should –
- (i) reckon at least one year's experience in transport planning and management;
  - (ii) possess good interpersonal and communication skills both written and spoken;
  - (iii) possess good analytical, monitoring, evaluation and problem-solving skills;
  - (iv) have the ability to work in a multi-disciplinary team;
  - (v) be able to meet deadlines; and
  - (vi) be computer literate.

**NOTE**

1. Candidates should produce written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed.
2. **The onus for the submission of written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed and equivalence of qualifications (if applicable) from the relevant authorities (Higher Education Commission or Mauritius Qualifications Authority) rests with the candidates. Applications will not be considered in case of non-submission of written evidence of experience/knowledge claimed and Equivalence Certificate, as appropriate, by the closing date.**
3. Candidates may be required to take part in a written examination.
4. The Commission reserves the right:
  - (i) to convene **only** the best qualified candidates for interview; and
  - (ii) not to make any appointment following this advertisement.

**IV. DUTIES AND SALARY**

1. To be responsible to the head of the Ministry or any officer designated by him for the performance of the following duties –
  - (a) conducting research programmes, surveys, studies, investigations and appraisals so as to assist in the formulation of land transport and light rail policies;
  - (b) evaluation of current transport projects to determine their impact on social, environmental and economic factors;
  - (c) assisting in –
    - (i) devising efficient and safe systems and methods of transport;
    - (ii) the preparation of reports, briefs and materials related to the land transport sector including light rail;
    - (iii) the formulation of a Master Plan or appropriate Action Plan for the land transport sector;
    - (iv) developing appropriate metrics related to transportation analysis;

- (v) framing strategies to promote public transport;
  - (vi) conceptualising appropriate mechanism to rationalise subsidies/financial support provided to transport industry and in ensuring sustainability of the transport system;
  - (vii) formulation of policies on transport planning and management; and
  - (viii) the development of Road Transport/Light Rail Projects including road and light rail safety; and
- (d) making proposals to optimise transport services and enhance mobility.
2. To attend meetings and committees, as and when required.
  3. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
  4. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Transport Analyst/Senior Transport Analyst in the roles ascribed to him.

The permanent and pensionable post carries salary in scale Rs 37,290 x 925 – 39,140 x 970 – 46,900 x 1,050 – 49,000 x 1,100 – 54,500 x 1,450 – 58,850 x 1,750 – 62,350 x 1,850 – 67,900 x 1,900 – 75,500 x 2,250 – 86,750 a month.

However, for the year 2026, the discounted initial salary would be Rs 35,353.

## **V. MODE OF APPLICATION**

1. 2. Candidates already in the service **should** submit their Application Form **in duplicate**, the original to be sent directly to the Secretary, Public Service Commission and the duplicate through their respective Supervising Officer/Responsible Officer.
